Improvement in learning outcomes of the children

Parents with a child in a Government school earn up to **INR 8,000 per month**, are engaged as **daily wagers/ migrant laborers**, and are generally educated up to **Grade VIII**

55% Children in Grade V cannot read Grade II text

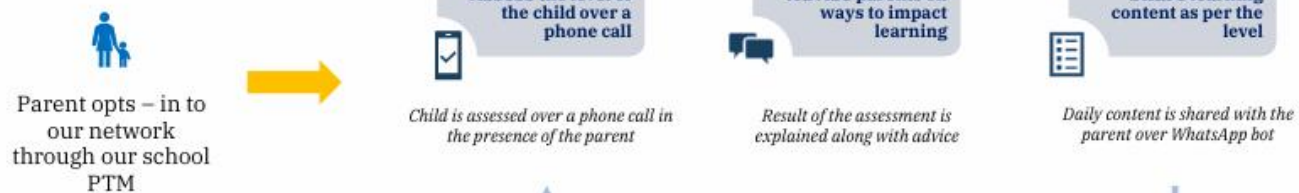
75% Children in Grade V cannot do a simple division

To address the issue of youth unemployment, TNS India Foundation has developed college-embedded program – Campus to Corporate Careers (C2C) to bridge the skills and employment gap for high-performing disadvantaged youth

The Campus to Corporate Careers (C2C) program, has positively impacted over 25,000 families in the past ten years.

The initiative primarily targets first-generation learners among final-year students in lower-tier colleges, focusing on those studying accounting, finance, and IT

Student attendance – Daily classes are conducted 6 days in a week. Daily classes are conducted as per the class routine and daily lesson plan is followed during center time. Students were attended their daily class with **attendance percentage of 88.14%** and overcame their learning gaps Bengali, English and Mathematics. **Beneficiary** – Total **1800 children** are getting benefited from the 60 education centers supported by BMFL.



Teacher Refreshers – Monthly teachers' refreshers are placed. In this capacity building process teachers are empowered on concurrent rectification measures on methodologies. In this quarter, **100% teachers were attended in this training programme.**
